And the cherry on top is all the **CARES** and **ARPA** money the federal government doled out to the local governments.

# LET'S TALK ABOUT AUDITS

#### When is a "Regular Audit" required?

MCA requires local governments that have annual revenues in excess of \$750K to have an audit.

#### What is a Federal Audit?

Often called a "Single Audit", a "Uniform Guidance Audit", or a "Really Expensive Audit" is required when the local government's annual federal expenditures exceed \$750K.

# How is a Federal Audit different?

A federal audit is a regular audit **plus** additional testing and reporting as required by the federal granting agencies.

### Who are the users of the audit?

I know most of my clients have never had anyone come in and ask for a copy of their audit. However, a lot of entities review the audit reports behind the scenes. Here is a list to name a few:

- Elected officials

- Bonding companies

County Attorney

- State agencies

- Local Newspapers

- Federal granting agencies

- Banks

- MT Historical Society

# When is your audit due? (Gestation period of your audit baby)

A Regular audit is due 12 months after your fiscal year end.

A Federal audit is due 9 months after your fiscal year end.

### What opinions can an auditor give?

Unqualified – also called a "clean opinion". The financials are fairly presented.

Qualified – The financials are fairly presented EXCEPT for this or that problem.

<u>Disclaimer</u> – The auditor could not come to an opinion. Not a good sign.

Adverse - The financial statements are NOT fairly presented. Very bad.

Going Concern – There is substantial doubt the entity will continue in the future. Also, very bad.

## What is a Biennial Audit?

Auditing two fiscal years in one report. While not real popular, it does allow governments to save a few \$\$ if their books are in good shape.

#### How about audit findings?

Findings/Recommendations are errors or risks that the auditor discovered which were deemed important enough to include in the report. There are two types of findings:

Significant Deficiencies – An error or risk in which management would not normally identify.

Material Weaknesses – A BIG significant deficiency.
